Lilly Ledbetter Urges Congress to Pass the Paycheck Fairness Act

I January marked the fifth anniversary of the Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act, and AAUW and Ledbetter joined forces

with coalition partners to challenge members of Congress to take action to end the gender pay gap, including passage of the stalled Paycheck Fairness Act. According to Ledbetter, "giving women my Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act without the Paycheck Fairness Act is like giving them a nail without the hammer." The Paycheck Fairness Act closes loopholes in the 1963 Equal Pay Act and provides solutions to address pay inequities.

Ianuary also saw the release of Maria Shriver's Report:

A Woman's Nation Pushes Back from the Brink. The Report leverages AAUW research and has been widely reported in the media. According to the report, closing the gender pay gap would cut the poverty rate in half and add \$448 billion to the U.S. economy. The report also highlights other challenges faced by women and families, including access to quality childcare, work leave for family care, and affordable higher education.

You can have an impact. Please join Lilly Ledbetter in urging your members of Congress to pass the Paycheck Fairness Act. Also, contact your members of the Georgia Assembly and Governor Deal and ask for their support to pass the Family Care Act (H.B. 290).
