President's Message

I hope everyone is staying warm during this cold weather. Since January 1, it has been a challenge to remember to date items using the year 2016. I was looking at AAUW of Georgia's Value Promise, which states that belonging to AAUW you belong to a "community that breaks through educational and economic barriers so that all women and girls have a fair chance." I think that to have a fair chance and reach our potential we must be healthy.

February is Heart Month. In the United States heart disease is the leading killer of women, and one in four women dies of heart disease. A Women's Heart Disease Study conducted in 2012 found that the awareness and knowledge about heart disease in women still lags, especially in minorities and younger women.

Coronary Heart Disease (CHD) is the most common type of heart disease and occurs when plaque builds up on the inner coronary arteries. CHD can cause angina, heart failure, heart attack, and cardiac arrest. Angina is chest pain or discomfort. Heart failure occurs when the heart muscle cannot pump blood around the body effectively. Heart attack is the death of heart muscle due to lack of oxygen resulting from a blockage of a coronary artery. Cardiac arrest occurs when the heartbeat stops, the heart stops, blood circulation stops, there is no pulse.

Women are usually older than men when heart disease develops, and the cause is most often linked to hypertension, diabetes, valvular disease, and coronary artery disease. The good news is that women with heart failure have better survival rates than men.

You can control many CHD risk factors. Lifestyle changes, taking medication as needed, and medical and surgical procedures can help women lower their risk. Beneficial lifestyle changes include exercising as one is able, eating healthy foods, lowering fats and carbohydrates, maintaining a healthy weight, quitting smoking, reducing sodium intake, and lowering blood pressure.

Friday, February 5th is National Wear Red Day, part of the American Heart Association's Go Red for Women campaign. So wear your red and create awareness of heart disease. Also speak to your health care provider about a heart scan. Let's have a healthy 2016 with changes to reduce our risks for heart disease!

The Season of Hearts

It's the season of love and your head has probably already begun being filled with images of chocolates, roses, and hearts. However, during this Valentine's Day season many women have started thinking less about the hearts filled with sweet candies and more about the one that is pumping their blood. According to a recent article by NBC News, "Despite stunning improvements in cardiovascular deaths over the last decade, women still fare worse than men and heart disease in women remains underdiagnosed, and undertreated." Additionally, "While the most common heart attack symptom is chest pain or discomfort for both sexes, women are more likely to have atypical symptoms such as shortness of breath, nausea or vomiting, and back or jaw pain," the Heart Association said. Although experts have known the significant differences in heart diseases based on gender, many are concerned that women still are ignoring heart risk. "The result is the same—when blood flow to the heart is decreased for any reason, a heart attack can occur," the NBC stated, "..that adds up to 53,000 women dying from heart attacks every year."
