AAUW OF GEORGIA Fall Board Meeting Report:

Co-presidents Blondie Chitunya-Wilson and Mary Lynn Merkle along with Myra Carmon (currently serving as co-president of AAUW of GA) represented Atlanta Branch at the fall board meeting held in Columbus on Saturday, September 16th. Here are some highlights of the meeting:

*Rome and Milledgeville both relinquished their Branch charters. Many of us will remember warmly Gordon Leiter, who kept the Rome Branch going for the past several years. His wife, a longtime member, passed away recently, and Gordon has given up his leadership position. Milledgeville, reactivated in recent years, was unable to sustain membership and leadership.

*Columbus, struggling with membership, is not ready to surrender. Longtime Columbus leader, Erma Banks, said that like the Phoenix, they will "rise again." We wish them well.

*Spring Convention will be held either April 14th or 28th. Houston-Peach Branch has offered leadership in finding a location.

*In terms of ERA in Georgia the women present unanimously voiced their support.

*Debbie Karvey, AAUW of GA public policy chair, spoke about the Family Care Act for which AAUW, along with other organizations, has lobbied long and hard. Although successfully passed, it has limitations, and the struggle is not over.

*Debbie also reported that the Gender Pay gap is now at 80%-improved but this struggle also continues. National AAUW will publish an updated "The Simple Truth."

*The nominating committee will be recruiting new officers. Please consider serving if you are asked. Strong leadership results in a strong voice for change, and ERA looms ahead.

Recently our Atlanta Branch was the object of a scam. As you know, we pride ourselves on being team players, on supporting fellow board members and leaders who are trying to achieve successes and goals for our Branch. And that being said, here is the "tale."

Not too long ago one of our co-treasurers received an urgent "email" from one of our co-presidents. She had a project in the wings that needed immediate financial support-- -about \$8,000 worth; and if she had a chance to make it happen, the money had
