Alta Birdsong will complete her 13 th (not consecutive) year as treasurer of Atlanta Branch on July 1, 2018. But wait, there's more! She has also served the currently serving Branch treasurer in preparing taxes, filing reports, and auditing financial records for many additional years. That's a lot of service to Atlanta Branch. Further, she served two terms as president, was Bookfair co-chair twice, served nine years on AAUW of GA board (3 of those as president or president elect, and six years on AAUW's national committees.

Alta came to Atlanta from Texas. She was a 1955 magna cum laude graduate of the University of North Texas. She was a proud member of Delta Gamma Fraternity and was named to Mortar Board, a leader even then. Her first employer was Texas Instruments where she was the first female hired as a cost engineer.



Her arrival here with her husband Ken and her two young children, daughter Suzanne and son Layne, marked the beginning of a long career in community services in our area. Those community services have gone far beyond Atlanta Branch—including leadership positions in Camp Fire USA, Metro Atlanta United Way, DeKalb County committees, and DeKalb Board of Education. As one can imagine, her awards and recognitions for service have been many.

Since joining the Atlanta Branch in the early 70's she has made things happen—initiating many community programs through the years to serve our mission of equity for women and girls. It's undoubtedly through her efforts and those of other women who share her creativity, her enthusiasm and her energy that positive attitudes and opportunities for women in leadership roles in Atlanta and beyond continue to increase.

Alta looks back at her 45 years of membership in AAUW with gratitude for her many friendships, her opportunities to be a catalyst in providing scholarships, and for her many opportunities to build her own leadership skills. She is still enthusiastic about our future possibilities. She would love to see us reach out to our community with some type of women's program such as a Woman-to-Woman Summit. Her concern is that our member rolls must encompass more younger women. They, after all, are our insurance for another century of AAUW Atlanta Branch making a difference in the lives of women and girls.

How fortunate we have been and are to have Alta Birdsong in our midst! On behalf of a grateful Branch, we celebrate your accomplishments and await your next efforts to move us forward.






Bookfair Treasures in Your Attic?
