Did you spend hours sorting, pricing, and/or packing in the Bookroom? Did you collect books in the too hot, too cold, or somewhere in-between weather from our bookdrops? Did you spend some hours in late September/early October out at Perimeter Mall working the Bookfair? If you answered "yes" to one, two or all of the above, please take a long moment to pat yourself on the back. We were amazingly successful!

Our Branch members and friends accumulated a total of 7,717 ½ adjusted hours. (You'll remember that adjustments are such things as working particular days at the Bookfair and double credit for book pick-ups.)

Although we are not in competition with our sister Bookfair Branches, Atlanta Branch had 71% of the total of 10,842.13 hours worked. It's that kind of support for this huge project that allows us the freedom to work toward our mission of advancing equity for women and girls through so many different avenues.

We do not have the actual proceeds available yet. Those will be announced at our Celebration Gathering at Marlow's Tavern in Dunwoody Village on Sunday, November 12. Be sure, though, we will make a difference through our philanthropic activities with the monies we have earned.

#### An Afternoon to Remember

Eclipse di Luna was the location of Atlanta Branch's July 23, 2017 hosting of 25 Fellows of the Mandela Washington Fellowship for Young African Leaders, the flagship program of the Young African Leaders Initiative of President Obama. The Atlanta Branch fulfilled a need identified by the State Department – giving the Fellows an opportunity to meet Americans on a local level. The 25 Fellows consisted of 13 women and 12 men from 19 different African countries. These 25 young adults between 25 and 35 are already successful in their home countries and it was exciting to talk to with them and learn of their plans. The young women seemed very interested to learn that there is an international component of AAUW and wanted information on groups in their countries.

Kay Collins talked with Freddy, a banker in Zimbabwe. She also talked with an advertising agency owner, Floyd from Johannesburg. He was excited to hear about Kay's "classic advertising" experiences from her career in the 1970's and 90's. Pat talked to a young woman who has started a cosmetics business and is beginning to start the 3rd phase, manufacturing the products. Gereld Katabazi, from Uganda, has a coffee business and some us were fortunate enough to be given a pound of his coffee.

Other Branch members and guests in attendance were Blondie Wilson, Ingrid Reinhard, Ruth and Alan Yurchuck, Sharon and John Hoover, Amira Saleh, and Betty Arden. John Hoover commented that he was impressed with the people he met. They were very intelligent and engaging and it gave him hope for the future. Ruth felt it was very worthwhile, as did Betty Arden. Blondie hopes it will happen again and plans to invite some of her coworkers to attend and network with the Fellows. Ingrid enjoyed meeting the participants and learning about the Fellows Program. Amira said it very well: "I wasn't aware of the tremendous work being done in the Mandela Washington Fellowship Program at Clark Atlanta University. I had the opportunity to sit down with a few of them to learn about their aspirations and passions in the best way, an engaging conversation one-on-one. I would like to see this program continue for its final scheduled year and into the future and AAUW Atlanta has the opportunity to be a part of it." Huiping Du, our resident professional photographer, and her assistant took 169 great pictures. We received very positive evaluations and hope we will have the opportunity to host for the 5th and last year of the program.
