AAUW Atlanta's very own Bookroom has begun assisting women serving time at Lee Arrendale Prison. Virginia Dilkes, member of a prison ministry group at Lee Arrendale, and Betty Slater, our own Atlanta Branch member, both attend Peachtree Presbyterian Church. Through the connection they have established, the Bookroom is now providing books to these women to offer a recreational and productive way to get engaged with each other and with the ministry group Virginia services. Virginia said she was "pleasantly surprised with how much the inmates are becoming engaged with what the AAUW has offered their library," a true testament to the value of Betty and the Bookroom's work.

Sharon Bevis-Hoover, Bookroom Chair, has been in close contact with Virginia in order to receive the titles and author names in which the women are specifically interested. From the books and resources that the Bookroom receives from its many bookdrops, the Atlanta Branch has served these incarcerated women and benefitted their time spent at Lee Arrendale. Virginia has emphasized how well AAUW has affected the lives of these women in "a very positive way."
