Working to Make Districts 'Fair' in Georgia

Editor's Note: Julia Leon spoke at our recent Affiliate meeting on March 8, 2025. She has graciously provided the following recap of some of the information shared at that meeting. She has also provided suggestions as to how we can help and stay informed about Fair District GA activities.

Georgia's History of Legislative Redistricting (and Impact)

Georgia has a long history of legislative redistricting that unevenly weighs voters across geographic areas with the aim of reducing the voice of Black voters and voters in the minority party. In our last election, only 3% of the races were competitive. Such gerrymandering has entrenched political power by allowing legislators to choose their voters rather than voters choosing their representatives. The result is polarized politics, with legislators who do not accurately reflect their constituents' will. You see the consequences in, for example, Georgia's low ranking in per pupil funding adequacy (34th). Gun safety, health, and reproductive rights are other issues where our legislators are out of step with their constituents.

What Can We Do to Make Districts 'Fair' in Georgia?

We can solve unfair districts by establishing a transparent, nonpartisan redistricting process led by independent commissions rather than partisan legislators. Fair Districts GA (FDGA) is dedicated to achieving this vision by advocating for redistricting reform, educating the public, and engaging in legislative advocacy.

You can help us now with the Legislator Fair District Pledge:

- Find out if your legislators have signed it and if not ...ask them to sign it.
- If they have signed it, thank them for their support.
